

## bookfdcc10 Contemporary Collections: This Backpack is Too Heavy



### Required tools and supplies:

- X-acto knife and fresh blade
- A thin metal straightedge ruler. Make fold lines by pressing against edge of the ruler.
- Scissors
- Good cutting mat. No cardboard, for it will ruin your project.
- Fast-grab, quick-dry white craft glue that dries clear
- Small piece of aluminum foil to use as a glue pot
- Slender flat artist's paintbrush to apply glue

### Text Book Assembly:

1. Fold a box. Use sharp edged ruler to fold against.
2. Glue tabs to inside of box.
3. Take book cover and fold down each side of spine.
4. Glue box to spine and back cover.
5. Glue inside cover to blank surface of front cover.

### Post-Its Assembly:

1. Stack Post-its.
2. Clamp stack with clips.
3. Paint quick-dry glue along top. This will hold the stack as a pad.

### Bag of Candy Assembly:

1. Fold in half.
2. Glue together the very edge of the bottom and side.
3. When dry stuff with tissue.
4. Glue together the top opening.

### Pencil Assembly:

1. Roll pencil tightly from the large end.
2. Glue the rolled end.
3. Touch up eraser and pencil point with colored pens or paint.

### Composition Notebook Assembly:

1. Cut out all the composition pages.
2. Carefully stack pages and clamp both ends with small black office clips.
3. Paint a layer of quick-dry glue to the spine area of the pages. This will make the pages stick together when the glue dries.
